

Can't get to the West Eugene Wetlands? We'll bring them to you!



This school year, the West Eugene Wetlands Education Center is sponsoring a FREE outreach program . Lessons are designed to encourage hands-on, interactive learning and for students to apply several of the Oregon science and math benchmark standards. Programs are designed for 25-30 students.

Programs offered are:

“What is a wetland?” Students will discover the sensory experiences they would encounter on a visit to the wetlands when they explore a “touchy-feely” box full of wetland objects.

- This activity takes 45-55 minutes and can be done in the classroom.
- This presentation is designed for 1st-5th grade classes

“Migration” Migratory birds fly thousands of miles each year to other parts of the world. Why do they do it? What dangers lurk for them along the way? Interactive activities will bring some of these wetland birds to life as students explore the answers to these and other questions.

- This presentation takes one hour and 15 minutes
- A large space such as a gym or open classroom is preferable for this activity
- This activity is designed for 3rd-5th grade classes

- Programs will be scheduled on a first come, first serve basis. Upon receiving your registration we will contact you to make final arrangements.
- Please mail the enclosed registration form to the address below. Registering early means that there is a better chance of getting us to your classroom on the dates you requested.
- Due to WREN staff schedules, preferred days for programs are Monday, Wednesday and Friday. You can schedule programs anytime on those days between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- To increase efficiency, please coordinate with 1-2 other teachers at your school to schedule a program on the same day.
- The WREN staff person or volunteer who will be coming to your classroom will contact you a couple of days prior to arriving for a final confirmation.
